Consider collecting an Advent basket of these personal items, one small item every day. You can put in a bar of soap, a toothbrush, a package of combs, or a small bottle of shampoo each day. On Sunday, Dec. 18 (the fourth Sunday in Advent) and on Christmas Day, we will gather all of these baskets together. When we combine all of our daily gifts, what a wonderful donation we will have for the Maine Township Food Pantry!

What a joy to give out of our abundance. We are truly blessed by God. What a blessing to give to others, just as God gave us the most wonderful Gift of all—Jesus Christ. Have a blessed and joy-filled Christmas.
